Atkins Orange Stop Team ~ Mile 6

Location: Mile 6.5 Colorado & Stone Creek Job time: **06:45 AM - 09:00 AM** Saturday, April 28

Process

All the oranges for this Atkins Orange Stop are being cut on Friday, so Saturday morning's job is simply to hand out the oranges to the runners and walkers when they come through the stop. All supplies mentioned below will be provided.

Regarding the orange station the day of the race:

- Line up the foldable tables along the course and inside the concrete street curb alignment. Tables should not protrude into the street paving.
- Volunteers need to spread out—do not get bunched up.
- Coolers with bags of oranges need to be arranged near the tables.
- The volunteers will need serving trays placed on the tables
- Volunteers will need plastic gloves to handle the oranges. Volunteers will grab orange slices from the trays.
- Volunteers hold up one slice at the runners arm height. Hold up the slices in way that the runners can readily see them. If you just have the tray out, the runners will dump over the whole tray. Better to try to hand the slices individually to the runners.
- As the runners take the slices from the trays, volunteers will be needed to reload trays from oranges stored in coolers.

Regarding clean up and race day cleaning:

- We will place large tarps on the ground in the flanking grass down the course for runners to toss their orange peels on. Runners are quick to figure this out—and they toss them on it. Tarps help a bunch for post-race clean up.
- When gaps in runners/walkers allows, volunteers should try to get dropped slices moved to the side so runners and walkers don't trip/slip. This can be tricky. Unfortunately a lot of slices end up near the curb as part of this process.
- Assist with the cleanup of the Orange Stop.
